

The Motherland and the Holyland

Departing February 15, 2010 from Atlanta, GA

Itinerary

Day 1 – Monday, February 15

Depart on our transatlantic flight to Cairo. Dinner and breakfast are served onboard.

Overnight: En route

Day 2 – Tuesday, February 16

Arrive Cairo: Upon arrival at Cairo International Airport, we will be met and assisted through Immigration and Customs by our tour representative, then transferred to our hotel. Dinner is at the hotel. Overnight: Cairo

Day 3 – Wednesday, February 17

Pyramid-Sphinx-Museum: The excitement begins this morning with a visit to **Cheops' pyramid**, one of the Seven Wonders of the World, and the **Sphinx**, the great god lion sentinel. Built over 35 centuries ago, (the towering pyramids built by Cheops' son Kephren and the other by Mycerinus were erected to preserve their bodies and treasures for the afterlife.) Continue on to the fabulous **Egyptian Museum**, regarded as one of the most prominent in the world, it offers visitors remarkable insights into Egypt's ancient history dating back 5000 years. The priceless antiquities include **King Tutankhamons's Treasures**, a spectacle beyond belief! Next stop lunch then continue to Old Cairo with stops at Ben Ezra Synagogue, Moalaka Church (better known as the "hanging church") and the Avu Segah Church dating back to the beginning of the 5th century. Our sightseeing will also include a stoup at the Leather Museum, a bazaar with time for shopping. Dinner and overnight: Cairo

Day 4 – Thursday, February 18

Today we leave Cairo with fond memories, our motor coach heads south through the Sinai, the same Desert that Moses and the children of Israel traveled for 40 years. Upon reaching the boarder we enter the Holyland at Eilat on the Red Sea were we have dinner and overnight. **Eilat**

Day 5 – Friday, February 19

Today we head for Tiberias. We motor coach through the Negev Desert, whose history dates backs to 2,000 BC. This land was inhabited by Abraham and his descendants. We see the tenth century forts constructed by Solomon to defend King David's rule over the Negev. We arrive at the south end of the Dead Sea where we can see the salt formations. We travel past Sodom and Gomorrah (believed to be under the sea). Genesis 19-13, "but the men were wicked and sinners before the Lord exceedingly....then the Lord rained upon Sodom and Gomorrah brimstone and fire". We may have time to stop at a pillar of salt said to be Lot's wife. Next is Massada. We'll ascend by cable car to visit the magnificent ruins of the fortress where the Jewish zealots made their last stand of the Judean revolt against Rome. After leaving Masada we continue north pasted, Qumran and Jericho were we view the **Mount of Temptation**. We make our way through the Jordan Valley with a visit the excavations at **Beit She'an** on to Tiberias for dinner and overnight. **Tiberias**

Day 6 – Saturday, February 20

Capernaum - Tabgha - Mt. of Beatitudes– After a delicious Israeli breakfast, we take a boat ride across the **Sea of Galilee** from Tiberias to **Capernaum**, the center of Jesus's Ministry and see the ruins of an ancient synagogue. Continue to **Tabgha** where the Multiplication of the Loaves and Fish took place and then on to the **Mt. of Beatitudes** where Jesus delivered his "Sermon on the Mount". We will visit **Kursi** (Gergasa) then on to **Bethsaida**. Our last stop will be the **Jordan River** Baptismal Site (Yardenit). Those wanting to be baptized in the Jordan may do so there. Dinner and **overnight in Tiberias**.

Day 7 – Sunday, February 21

Mt. Carmel - Nazareth – Cana - After breakfast Proceed to Nazareth the boyhood home of Jesus, and visit **Mary's Well** and onto Cana, the site of the first miracle. Continue to Megiddo, one of Solomon's fortress cities and guardian of the **Valley of Armageddon**. Then we will drive up **Mount Carmel** to Muhraqa, "Place of the Burning," where Elijah defeated the prophets of Baal. before continuing to in Jerusalem after stopping for a breath taking view of Old Jerusalem we drive to **Bethlehem**, (the birthplace of Jesus and King David) past Rachel's Tome, view Shepherd's field we stop to visit the **Church of the Nativity**. And Manger Square. Time permitting, we will stop at one of the famous Bethlehem gift shops. Dinner and **overnight in Jerusalem**.

Day 8 – Monday, February 22

Old City of Jerusalem. After breakfast we start our day with a visit to the top of the **Mount of Olives** for a panoramic view of **Old Jerusalem**, then walk down the Mount of Olives to the chapel that commemorates our Lord weeping over Jerusalem. Finally we come to the **Garden of Gethsemane** where we will see eight venerable olive trees, leafy offshoots of the trees that witnessed our Saviour's agony. We cross the **Kidron Valley** to the **House of Caiaphas** where Jesus was held prisoner. We will visit the traditional **Upper Room** and **tomb of King David**. We enter through the the Dung Gate leading to the **Western Wall** and the **Temple Mount** where we will see the **Dome of the Rock**. Then we will proceed to the Muslim Quarter where we will visit the beautiful **Crusader Church** dedicated to St. Anne and the nearby **Pool of Bethesda**. We'll walk the 14 Stations of the Cross along the **Via Dolorosa** to the **Church of the Holy Sepulchre**. Dinner and overnight Jerusalem

Day 9 – Tuesday, February 23

New City of Jerusalem. Old City Full day tour of the New City of Jerusalem, driving via the Knesset (Israel's Parliament) to the **Israel Museum**, which comprises art and archaeology and visit the **Shrine of the Book** housing the Dead Sea Scrolls. Continue to the **Model City of Jerusalem** from the time of the Second Temple. We will close our day with a visit to **Calvary** and the **Garden Tomb**, a peaceful spot where we can remember Christ's crucifixion, burial, and resurrection. We also have some time for shopping in the Old City. We say farewell to this wonderful land with a clear understanding of **Psalms 122:6 "Pray for the peace of Jerusalem"**. Dinner is on the way to the airport where you connect with your flight Home.

Day 10 – Wednesday, February 24

Everyone will be back home today.

- \$75.00 discount for every passengers that sent a deposit of \$250 no later than 9 months prior to departure date or
- \$50.00 discount for every passengers that sent a deposit of \$250 no later than 6 months prior to departure date

DEPOSIT AND REGISTRATION A \$449.00 (\$250.00 & 199.00 Insurance) deposit is required at the time of booking, plus passenger's full name (as it appears on passport), mailing address and telephone number. Fax, e-mail, or phone reservations are welcome. Deposit and/or payment in full must be received within 7days or reservation will automatically cancel. Full payment is due 60 days prior to the departure date. If payment is received less than 30 days before departure, please include a \$50 late fee.

FORM OF PAYMENT Personal Checks /Bank Checks / Certified Checks / Travelers Checks or Money Orders, are accepted forms of payment. Personal checks are acceptable if received more than 3 weeks prior to departure date. We also accept Credit Cards, American Express, Visa and Master Card). We do not charge credit cards payments received 30 days prior to departure date. Every reservation must be accompanied by a signed application. Reservations made with in 30 days of the departure date are subject to a \$50 late registration fee. Returned checks will incur a \$25 service fee. In case of computer or human billing error, we reserve the right to re-invoice participants with corrected billing.

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS A valid US passport is required for travel, valid at least 6 months after return date. If you are not a US citizen, please consult your local embassy or consulate for visa requirements. Cancellations due to lack of appropriate travel documentations (i.e., visa, passports, etc.) will incur usual penalties.
